Garden Update

We have finally been successful in gaining approval from the department to begin development on our Community Garden – hooray! So far, we have been successful in securing \$16,500 from a range of grants also. These include:

- SA Water \$8000
- One Forty One \$5000
- Bendigo Bank \$2500
- Woolworths/Landcare \$1000

Keep an eye out for development over the coming term as we begin to prepare the grounds, install rainwater tanks and build structures.

Our YELP students and each class will work with Wayne Horbury to begin construction of a range of structures such as worm farms, compost areas and the community vegetable stand.

If any other community members are interested in contributing through time and mentoring our students in some of these skills, please contact our front office.



We are also still loving all of our favourite activities like play dough, painting, playing outside and playing in the home corner!






INTERNATIONAL MUD DAY




INTERNATIONAL MUD DAY 2022

There are many benefits to Mud Play, Some include; stimulation of our senses, eye and hand coordination, gross motor skills, imagination and creativity and connecting with nature.



JP Media Arts


