STEVE THE STARTER

At Newbery Park Primary we learnt how to make a beginner sourdough starter. All we needed was flour, water and a little bit of patience. Now we have our very own bubbly, active starter (which we named Steve) and he makes THE BEST **sourdough bread**.

Without a starter, your bread won't rise. Sourdough starter is a live fermented culture of fresh flour and water. Once combined, the culture will begin to ferment and cultivate the natural yeasts found in our environment. A small portion is added to your bread dough to make it rise.

Bubbles indicate fermentation, which is what you want! However, it's okay if you don't see anything right away; the bubbles might have appeared and dissolved overnight while you were sleeping.

Then once a week we cook a sourdough loaf and eat it with butter and jam!

NEWBERY PARK PRIMARY






Back at school students researched life cycles of frogs with a buddy and discussed the importance of sustaining environments with their teachers





LOWER PRIMARY

Junior Primary Maths

This week we began learning about place value and begun a focus on teen numbers. Teen Numbers are tricky because they don't make sense in the way we say them. Place value focusses on the way we see numbers, the parts of numbers and how we can break down a number to understand our base 10 system.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Entry fee must be via official only. Please note that fees are not refundable.
2. Entries are to be made payable by direct debit, cheque or credit card.
3. Competitions shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf together with such local rules as are in force on the links over which the competition takes place. If a dispute arises on any point, it shall be decided by the Committee in Charge of the competition whose decision shall be final.
4. The Committee has the power to temporarily alter a player's Australian Handicap in accordance with the Australian Course Rating and Handicap System.
5. In every event the competitor will be drawn against each other for the day in such a manner as the Committee may arrange, and the Committee, or such person as the Committee may authorize, shall have the power to select a partner for any competitor whose partner is not present when called upon at the appointed start.
6. The Committee will make arrangements and have full power to alter or make any variations in the conditions should they deem it desirable.
7. The Committee may, in the event of bad weather, or for any other reason either shorten a contest or fix another day.
8. In the event of a tie, the winner shall be deemed as order.
9. 36 Hole SE Open Scratch - In the event of a tie a sudden death playoff will be conducted played in the sequence 1, 5, 3, 2 and 18 and 40. All other events to be conducted in the manner recommended by Golf Australia.
10. In handicap events - the nearest handicap or fraction thereof shall be applied.
11. The Committee reserves the right to discontinue or suspend back procedures and present trophies in circumstances where it is considered appropriate.
12. The committee shall have the power to cancel any event or to limit the numbers of entries, which may be required in different events, and to alter the time fixed for starting an event, as indicated in the program.
13. Winners are eligible for all prizes in each event. However the committee will restrict winners to one prize on any one day.
