It has been wonderful to see all our students refreshed and enthused to get into Term 3's learning.

School upgrades

- At the end of next month our new library and multipurpose room was to be developed in building 2. We have just received advice that building 2 will need considerate work, if not replacing as a result of a mould issue. Currently this building is not to be used whilst we await further advice.

Bus service





NAIDOC WEEK





Learning Intention

We are learning about the importance of NAIDOC Week in Australia and what it means to celebrate.

Success Criteria

I can discuss the importance of the theme 'For our Elders'.

I can research and explore the Indigenous Map of Australia.

I can review videos about honouring our Elders and discuss the importance.

I can write the language and Nation or Clan groups that these seven young people are from and locate these on a map.


I can research one of the Elders mentioned in the videos.

Learning Context: During NAIDOC week Upper Primary students learnt about the importance of celebrating and recognizing the culture, history and celebrating the achievements of Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Students looked at the AIATSIS Map of Indigenous Australia and researched what land we live upon. Students double checked the source of information by researching the local government and confirming that we live on Boandik country.

Students then participated in watching and discussing young First Nations people videos whereby discussion was had about building and creating stronger relationships with our elders.

Students created a poster of the words and phrases from the videos and designed a learning wall of our discussion.





JUNIOR PRIMARY

JAPANESE



Learning Intention:

We are learning about Japanese words for Nature.

Success Criteria:

I can collect nature pieces and design an art piece.

I can show demonstrate my Japanese Knowledge writing Japanese colours and labelling my nature art.

Task:

Students had to find some items from nature and create a nature art piece. They then needed to label the pictures with the colours and things used in Japanese. They had a tablemat to use to help them with their spelling of these words.

Excursion – Blue Lake Aquifer Tour







Learning Intention:

To understand that water is an important natural resource.

Success Criteria:

I can discuss the importance of water and how to sustain water for future generations.

Learning Context: During our excursion, students went on a Blue Lake Aquifer Tour and learnt about the importance of the water catchments in Mount Gambier. Students learnt about the history of the Blue Lake and looked at photos from the past.



Excursion - Bunnings Workshop


Learning Intention:

To apply understanding of sustainability in a workshop, using recycled materials.



I can record a sentence using the word sustainability. I can discuss how we can recycle and be sustainable at home.

I can design and create sustainable products from recycled goods.



Students learnt that sustainability is about small changes we can make to look after our planet. Students made and decorated recycled milk cartons and planted lettuce. Students also made wind chimes out of recycled metal keys.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY



Junior Primary

Learning Intention:

To identify heat and light energy.

To explore light from different sources.

To investigate how light travels in a straight line.

Success Criteria:

I can identify heat and light as a source of energy from various sources.

I can conduct an experiment to show how heat changes a product.

I can conduct an experiment to show how light travels in a straight line.

In the classroom:

The Junior Primary Students have been investigating different forms of heat and light energy. They conducted an experiment to show the changes to a corn kernel once heated. We have also been lucky enough to enjoy some sunshine and spend some time weeding our vegetable garden in preparation for our new plants to be planted.





















SPECIALISED SUBJECTS

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY



Upper Primary

Learning Intention:

To investigate how light travels in a straight line. To investigate how objects move from a push or pull force.

Success Criteria:

I can conduct an experiment to show how light travels in a straight line.

I can identify that friction is a contact force to slow things down.

In the classroom:

Students investigated the influence of friction on moving objects. They identified friction is a contact force that slows things down and applied this to everyday activities eg, sliding down a waterslide.













PRESCHOOL



Learning Context:

Preschool students have been reading "Giraffes Can't Dance" by Giles Andrea and have been learning new vocabulary words with the help of the Pre-Literacy Curriculum. We have been expanding on these at the numeracy table by using magnetic letters and then discussing how three-letter words can change when exchanging one letter at a time.

Learning Intention:

We are reading and learning about vocabulary and their meanings through books and from the Vocabulary Wall.

Success Criteria:

I can understand the meaning of words from texts.

I can act out dramatic play scenes from story books.

I can collect sort and organise data.

I can create texts for a range of purposes.
